Reports:

Board Members:

Six Board members recently attended the Spring Legal Workshop held in Gering on March 13th. They concluded that this workshop had very beneficial information on the role of a Board member regarding topics such as step by step process for hearings, reduction in force and contracts. The use of our attorney is also beneficial when conducting a hearing. Other workshops attended by Board members included budget and finance (Jones) and Legislation (Jones, Coon). President Richards attended the President's Retreat in North Platte.

Administrator's report (Jeff West):

Highlights:

- LB 803: The vote was 35-0 in the general file. It will now go to Select and then to Final reading. If the bill passes, the real work will begin to apply for a waiver.
- Head Start Building Maintenance: Dr. West explained that we have a need to reorganize our maintenance staff and hire one additional staff to help with building
 maintenance and vehicle maintenance. This employee will be paid 75% out of
 Head Start grant funds and 25% from ESU funds. The Board agrees to begin
 this process.
- Panhandle Beginnings Day Treatment/Day School: We would like to use the
 upcoming year to plan how to organize the program by drafting policies and
 procedures. He would like to move Dr. Katie Carrizales from Behavioral
 Specialist to a Clinical Director position. She would still be able to do the job she
 is doing now, we would just add contract days to her regular contract. We have
 just learned of a grant for Masters Level Psychologist that we will apply for. If
 awarded, that person could help her. We could also offer the northern
 panhandle psychology services.

• Safety Manual: We are in the process of finalizing a safety manual. It will go to the Directors for review/changes and then to the Safety committee. When the manual is complete, we will present it to the Board for approval. There was discussion regarding using table top scenarios for training.

Head Start (Donna Jenne, Director):

- Policy Council Meeting Minutes (2/27/18) and Child Development Performance Reports were uploaded to the website for Board review.
- Winona Fabre', Review Team Leader, spoke to the Board about her role in reviewing how our governing body uses data to administer and oversee the Head Start/Early Head Start programs. She and her team have been contracted through the Office of Head Start as part of the grant's performance standards. These standards require monitoring of the grantee throughout the 5 year grant cycle. This process identifies areas for improvement and strengths as part of the grantee's self-assessment process. She asked specific questions of the Board members such as who had educational, legal and financial background. Educational background: Coon, Tollman, Millette, Marx, Jones. Legal: Sinner, Richards. Finance: Knapper, Marsh.
