#### Reports:

ESU 13 staff, Laura Barrett, Director of Special Services, Dr. Katie Carrizales, Licensed Clinical Psychologist, Nationally Certified School Psychologist and Behavioral Health consultant and Paul Smith, Director of Psychology Services, updated the Board on two of our current projects: IOP (Intensive Outpatient Therapy) and Panhandle Beginnings Day School and Day Treatment Facility.

We are collaborating with Region I to provide a higher level of mental health and/or substance abuse service for those students who need more intense services. This program is designed to take services to the student, alleviating the burden of travel. Therapists will travel to the preferred location (school, community building, etc.)

- IOP will include 9 or more hours of intensive level services per week. It is designed to include a combination of family, group, individual therapy as well as psycho-education.
- > Treatment plans will be individualized to best meet each client's unique needs.
- Therapeutic services will be subcontracted with community providers, enabling service provision to more remote geographic areas.
- IOP can serve as a step in/step out of more intense service provision such as day treatment/day school.
- > IOP will be funded by SOC grant, Medicaid and private insurance.

Our anticipated timeline is that in November or December, we can disperse informational materials to schools and the community and enroll providers. In January, provider orientation including Educational Systems training, Trauma Informed care and IOP expectations will be provided. Referrals will begin to be accepted.

In addition, a review of the proposal for the Panhandle Beginnings Day School and Day Treatment Facility was given. This is a collaboration between ESU #13 and Region I Behavioral Health.

Currently, the Panhandle of Nebraska has limited resources to detect and treat mental illness in school-age children. In a need assessment provided to school districts by ESU 13, districts indicated that there could be up to 30 youth that could benefit from a day school/day treatment program. School districts have implemented a variety of strategies to meet the needs of youths; however, they do not have the appropriate environment or the expertise to care for severely mentally ill youth.

Panhandle Beginnings will be a therapeutic treatment and educational setting that can provide an individualized, educational and therapeutic environment which supports an environment to help youth. This will be a collaborative effort through support of mental health professionals and educators.

The funding needed to run the Day Treatment Facility will need to come from a variety of resources. Some of the services are reimbursable through Medicaid, private insurance and grants.

The Administrator updated the Board of current facility projects. He presented to the Board that a door and siding by the multi-purpose room needs repaired. There is also

some rusting of metal by the conference room. Funding would be out of the cash reserve. The Board agreed to begin the bid process for the door repair now. Utilizing a strategic planning facilitator was discussed. It is the consensus of the Board that this is a good plan for the future of ESU 13.
